CELEBRATE IN SONG

You may have noticed there are new prayer/music books in the seats, called Celebrate in Song. The implementation of the revised translation of the Roman Missal will start on the First Sunday of Advent (Nov. 26-27). This resource also contains many hymns not previously published in the CBW 3, hymns for use especially for the Communion procession and for Lent. **Also on the first Sunday of Advent we will introduce a "Call to Worship" before the Mass begins. You will be invited to pause in silence to prepare ourselves for the Eucharistic celebration. M O R E** Another change that will affect all parishioners is the response to "The Lord be with you". The new one is "And with your spirit". Also, the Lectionary will remain at the ambo. **M O R E ---** there are cards in the pews (which we would ask that you please leave there). They contain the new wording and/or responses, i.e. the

Nicene Creed, which we will be using except during Lent and the Easter season. You are asked to bow when receiving the consecrated host but not for the consecrated wine. You are also asked to remain standing and sing after receiving communion.

IMMACULATA AFTER-SCHOOL SNACK PROGRAM

This year we are asking your support in providing help throughout the year with snacks

for Immaculata's after-school programs. Non-perishable items (nut free) such as individual puddings, applesauce, fruit cups, individual cheese & cracker strips, granola bars, juice boxes, cheese strings, Baby Bel cheese, etc. would be gratefully accepted. There are baskets at the back of the church in which to put the items.

CHANGES TO THE ROMAN MISSAL

Why "chalice" and not "cup"? In the Eucharistic Prayers during the consecration, where God transforms ordinary bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ His Son, the priest uses the words of Jesus at the Last Supper. In the New Missal during the consecration of the wine into the Blood of Christ, the priest prays: "Take this all of you and drink from it, for this is the "chalice" of my blood...". Using the word "chalice" instead of "cup" helps us remember the Cross as well as the Last Supper because we only use chalices for Mass, whereas we drink from cups all the time in daily life. The Mass is not only the Last Supper – a sacred meal – it is also the Offering of Christ on the Cross – a sacred Sacrifice. Also "chalice" reminds us that we are participating in the Heavenly Banquet when we celebrate Mass and not just a festive meal shared with our friends at home. The special altar vessels we use – the chalice, paten (the plate) and the ciborium (the covered dish) are made of precious metals to remind us of the most precious substance they contain, the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Christ in the Eucharistic Species.

MILK BAGS

Someone else has agreed to make use of the milk bags (outer one). So you may continue to bring them to the church and they will be used to make sleeping mats for the poor in countries affected by flooding and disasters.
